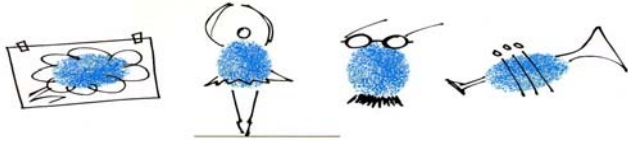

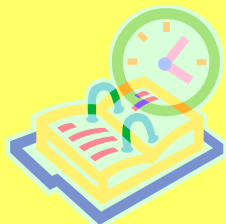
## Dr. Penny Wallin: Kennedy Center Alliance for Arts Education Network Leadership Committee member
